History of Zoology Dept., Role of Prof M Ramachandra Mohan as the Centenary Chairman

The Department of Zoology was started in the year 1909 at Central College, Bangalore; it was the affiliated to Madras University. Prof. C.R. Narayan Rao (1882-1960) was responsible for the establishment of the Department, of which he was the Head till 1937. He was a pioneer in the field of zoology. His student B. R. Seshachar wrote in 1960: Along with Sir Martin Onslow Forster and other Indian scientists he helped found the journal 'Current Science' in July 1932 along the lines of the journal **Nature**. He was its first editor. B.R. Seshachar's career started



in 1926, when he joined Central College, Bangalore, as a Demonstrator in Zoology. He studied zoology under Prof. C.R. Narayana Rao. He served in Central College for 34 years and was the head of the Department of Zoology for many years. Until 1952, the Department was affiliated to the University of Mysore. After his retirement from Central College he was invited, in 1960, by Prof. V.K.R.V. Rao, Vice-Chancellor of University of Delhi. The Department of Zoology was affiliated to Bangalore University in 1964. During 2009, the Department celebrated the 'Centenary Year. Prof M Ramachandra Mohan was the Chairman of the dept and iniated Centenary celebrations and year-long programmes announced by Bangalore University to mark the centenary celebration as part of its celebrations, and organized an international conference on environmental pollution, water conservation and health, from July 29-31. The conference is being attended by as many as 900 delegates from 22 states in India and 11 countries. A special postal cover marking the 100 years of the Zoology department are also been released. prof Mohan Instrumental in Creation of Centenary year Zoology logo and postal stamp cancelation From (29.7. 2010). Now it is a well-recognized Centre for teaching, research and extension activities. It is also well known for original research in Cytogenetics, Animal Physiology, Developmental Biology & Fishery Biology, and Ecotechnology.
